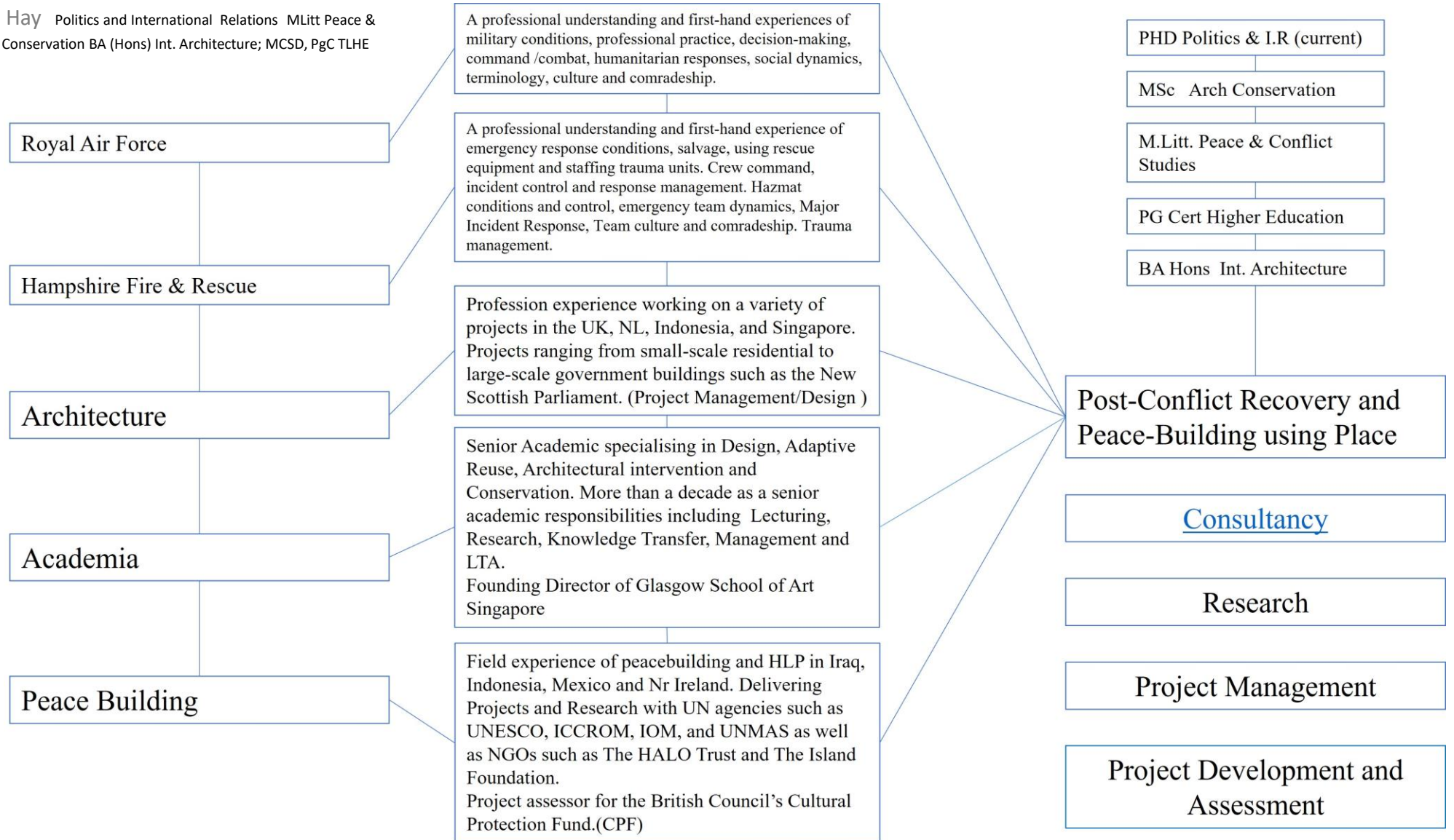

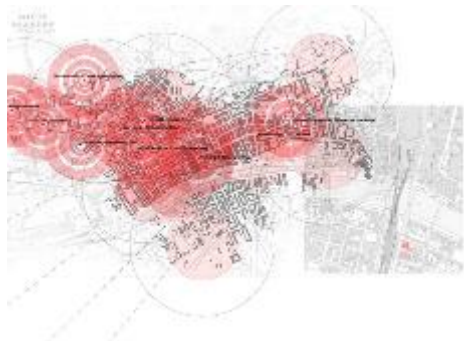

"The purpose of this project is to design and deliver an intervention aimed at changing the behaviour of a group in Mosul Old City who is at high risk of an explosive-ordnance related accident. Mosul city is located in Nineveh Governorate of northern Iraq, on the west bank of the Tigris river. Old City, the area of focus for this project, is three square kilometres and was the last Islamic State of Iraq and the Levant (ISIL) stronghold during the battle of Mosul between October 2016 and July 2017. As a result, UNEP estimates 90% of Old City was destroyed, and the area was heavily contaminated with mines and booby traps."

‘Developing co-created smart city solutions for managed adaptation and monitoring of hydro-meteorological climate change related risk in Mexico’ within ESALA, Edinburgh College of Art.

In collaboration with the Instituto Politecnico Nacional of Mexico, the study aims to explore and test climate change-related risk reducing strategies in vulnerable communities.

From community and government perspectives the research aims to understand the barriers to flooding risk-reducing strategies and identify viable approaches through active adaptation and resilience.

The research purpose is to test mechanisms for long term sustainable processes of risk monitoring and mitigation through engaging communities and organisations in a constructive 'dialogue of knowledges'. In addition, the research will assess how multi-level actors are influenced by, and can influence, climate change-related risks and the associated governance structures - such as the development of policies and norms - to allow greater support for climate change engagement.

Strategies explored considered 'smart city' perspectives, by implementing strategies to monitor and mitigate risk using data processing technologies systems in a pilot case in Mexico City with high levels of growth in the last two decades as well as exploring projections of migrations due to climate change.

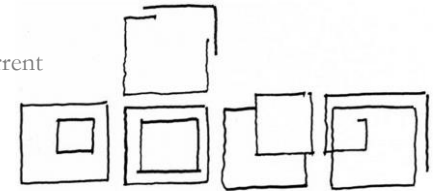
The pilot case targets vulnerable settlements at the dwelling level, and engage with local communities in the development of tools for:

A contract funded by the Japanese Government and facilitated by IOM to conduct an assessment, develop programming and provide training to IOM staff on appropriate memorialization initiatives to support trauma recovery, to open dialogue about past events and to promote social cohesion in areas which have experienced conflict, grave human rights abuses and displacement.

1. Assess current and previous memory initiatives in Iraq (both state led/top down, community inspired/civil society led/inclusive or exclusive/politically motivated/victim centered);
2. Assess opportunities to use conflict memory (perceptions) and memorialization techniques to foster trauma recovery, collective identity, social cohesion and community reconciliation in the Iraqi context with IOM field staff and other stakeholders
3. Develop a plan of action, identification of locations and key informants/communities with IOM staff to collect data on the role of ordinary buildings for trauma recovery and social cohesion
4. Develop a mapping of ordinary buildings in Ninewa with relevance for memorialization initiatives
5. Collect data on memory perceptions of the assessed ordinary buildings with affected communities through focus group discussions, town hall meetings and individual interviews
6. Develop a specific plan or practical strategy on how to deal with the ordinary buildings which can be beneficial for the affected communities
7. Make general recommendations to IOM (and UN/Gol/UNESCO) for appropriate memorialization initiatives that acknowledge suffering on the one hand and allow to rebuild relations between perceived perpetrators and victims on the other hand, are conflict sensitive and take into consideration customs and traditions, existing structures and power dynamics in the county;
8. Develop training materials for IOM PSS and SC field staff on memorialization techniques and programs on collective memory sites (monuments), remembrance days and how to deal with public sites which have become symbol for human rights violations and suffering.
9. Write a report on the complete assignment, including the community level assessment, feedback of IOM field staff, data collection, data analysis, intervention, trainings process and recommendations.
10. Present the findings to relevant audiences

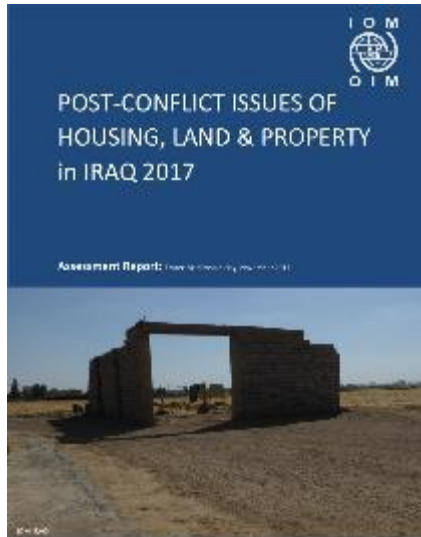

The current conflict in northern and central Iraq has resulted in the displacement of 3.1 million individuals, in addition to over one million IDPs who have returned to their areas of origin since January 2014. Those wishing to return face significant challenges in reclaiming their Housing, Land and Property (HLP) rights, and property disputes are known to escalate into conflict adding further to destabilisation in already fragile communities. Current grievances add a new layer to a historical pattern of HLP rights violations in Iraq, which stem from three prior and distinct waves of displacement between 1968 and 2008. With the addition of ongoing HLP right violations, current systems for redress are often informal, not always inclusive, overstretched and under-capacitated

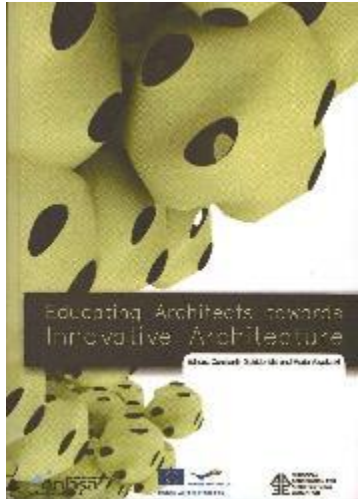
